Krishna Janmashtmi, simply known as Janmashtami, is an annual Hindu festival that celebrates the birth of Lord Krishna, the eighth Avatar of Lord Vishnu. It is celebrated on the eighth day (ashtmi) of the Krishna paksha in Bhadrapad. Lord Krishna was born in prison to Vasudeva and Devaki. Since his parents were prisoned by Devaki's brother Kansha. Kansha learned from the gods that the eighth child of Vasudeva and Devaki would kill him. However, Kansha killed all the seven children. Lord Krishna was born as the eighth child in the month of Bhadon. Before Kansha could kill Krishna, Vasudeva fled from the prison and gave Krishna to his friend, Nanda. Nanda belonged to Gokul and Krishna grow up in Gokul. On this day, people perform pujas at their houses or in temples. There are defined rituals for Janmashtmi. People decorate their houses with lights, flowers, and make rangoli. Sweets are offered to God and then distributed as Prasad. People place the photo of Lord Krishna in the middle of the Rangoli and worship. Women sing Krishan Aarti and perform dance.

Since, Lord Krishna loved to eat Makhan, people also play a game called matka phor. In this, people used to hang pots filled with butter and milk in the streets on the poles, men make pyramids to reach and break the pots. It is a very popular game in India, many people come to see it.
