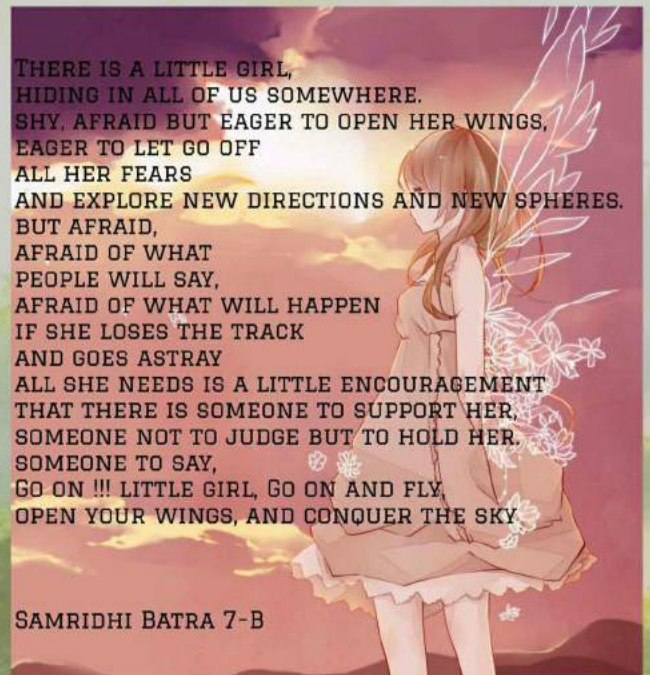


Go on little girl, Open your wings !!!!

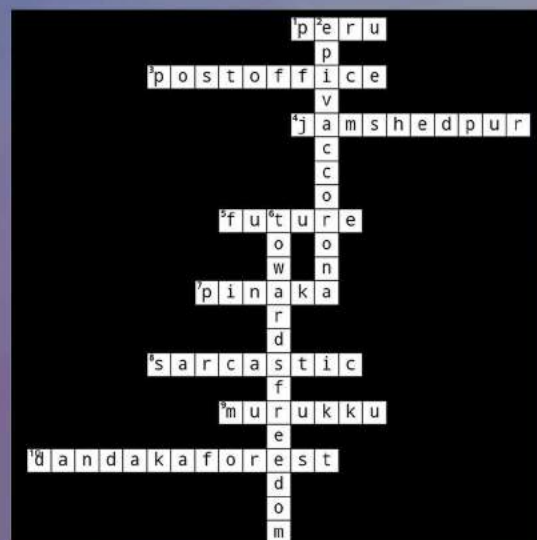
