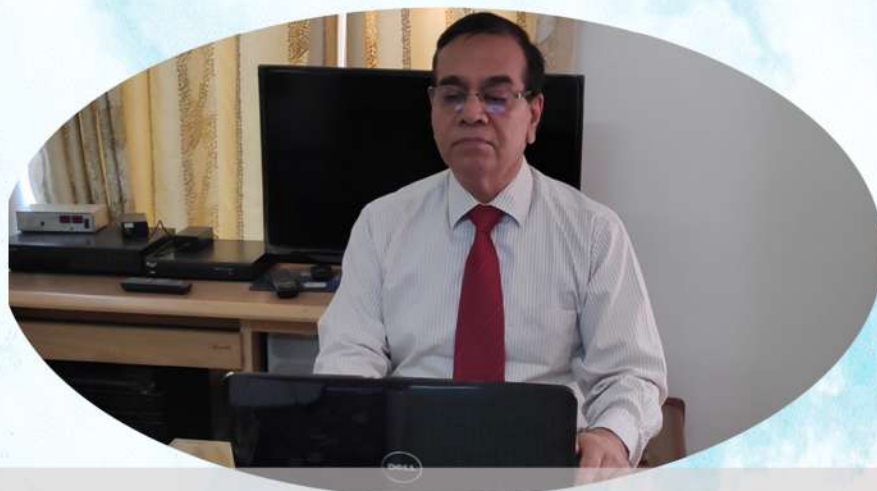

NEW EDUCATION POLICY 2020

The National Education Policy in effect until now is 34 years old. A more suitable vision was needed to meet the aspirations of the new India. This led to the adoption of NEP 2020. NEP 2020 is an ambitious and futuristic policy that ensures opportunities for children to hone their talents by fixing the lacuna in the education system. The following changes have been introduced in NEP:-

- The "10+2" structure will be replaced with "5 + 3 + 3 + 4" model.
- The emphasis on skills like analysis, critical thinking , co-curricular and vocational subjects will diversify their learning.
- Universal Access at all school levels will be guaranteed. It is proposed that around 2 crore children who drop out of school will be brought back into the education system.
- The teaching of Indian languages will be made mandatory.
- The multiple exit and re-entry system will provide flexibility to the students
- Students will be given flexibility in choice of subjects to study.
- Indian Sign Language will be standardized across the country.
- 360 degree holistic report card for students.
- Coding to be taught from class 6 onwards.

Even though there are some obstacles, it is believed that by implementing NEP 2020, India will take a step further towards development and become 'Atmanirbhar Bharat'.

बचपन की याद

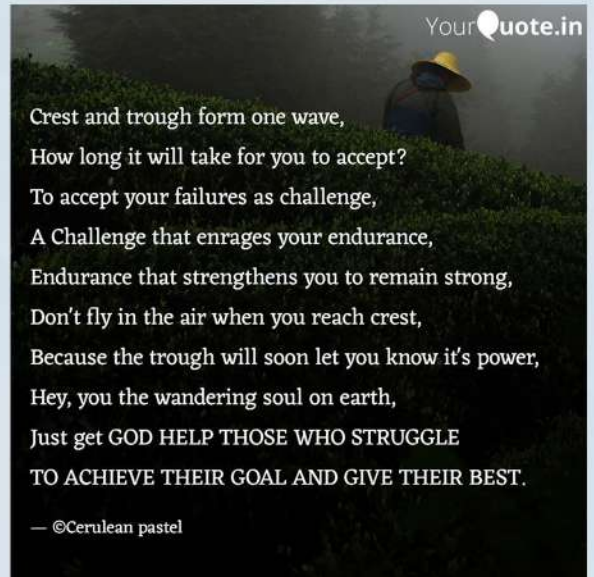
आज फिर कागज की नाव याद आ रही है
